## **Important Notes**

Students are responsible for meeting the prerequisites for various classes. Elective hours may be used to fulfill prerequisites. Students must be a senior and have completed the majority of the major coursework PRIOR to being enrolled in Capstone. It is also recommended that students take advanced (3\*\*\* or 4\*\*\*) level classes whenever possible to meet major requirements. Minors are not required but are recommended. Speak to your advisor to help you choose a minor that compliments your interests and career goals. Elective hours may be used to fulfill minor requirements. The most commonly pursued minors for INST majors include: foreign languages, political science, history, business, emergency management, and anthropology.
