This application is for all graduate scholarships awarded by the Department of Economics at the University of North Texas. By filling out and submitting this form, you will be considered for all available departmental scholarships for which you qualify.

In order to qualify for a graduate scholarship, applicants must: (1) have a minimum GPA of 3.0; (2) have earned no grades of "C" or below in any Economics graduate classes; (3) have completed at least 9 hours of Economics graduate coursework by the end of fall 2025 <u>OR</u> (4) be a UNT undergraduate who is entering the graduate program in fall 2026; AND intend to enroll as a full-time graduate student in the Master's program in Economics during fall 2026.

Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis, depending on the availability of funds, based on a collection of criteria including, but not limited to: GPA; GRE scores (the GRE is strongly preferred over the GMAT); other academic accomplishments; evidence of leadership activities; participation in scholarly research; participation in community service and other relevant extracurricular activities; and evidence that the applicant will complete his or her degree in a timely manner.

Scholarship funds will be dispersed during the fall semester of 2026.

6. List the classes (along with the semester and year) in which you intend to enroll to complete your master's degree. In addition, indicate the year and semester in which you intend to take (or have taken) each of the 3 required comprehensive exams (econometrics, micro and macro).

7. If you want to be considered for the Economics Alumni Advisory Council Scholars Scholarship ("AAC Scholarship"), submit a 500-word statement describing your past, current or intent for future student leadership at the University or surrounding community.
