

Colonel Jeremy Reeves, USAF

Col Jeremy Reeves entered the Air Force in 1999, receiving his commission through the AFROTC program at Texas Tech University, Texas. He is a command pilot with over 3,500 hours, primarily flying the KC-10 Extender. Over his twenty-six-year career, he commanded a flying squadron and served on the staff at a major command and a joint combatant command.

Col Reeves earned master's degrees from the Naval Postgraduate School and the Naval War College before coming to the University of North Texas in 2021. Studying under Professor Geoffrey Wawro, Jeremy specialized in 20th-century American military history. His dissertation focused on the Western Allied operational response to the concentration camps in Europe in 1945.

Col Reeves currently serves as the Chair of the Department of Strategy, Air War College, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. The Air War College is the Air Force's senior professional military education institution, providing post-graduate senior leader development programs focused on joint, multinational, multi-agency warfighting and international security operations, air, space, and cyberspace force strategy development, and national security planning.
