Degree Requirements for both BA & BS

- University Core
- College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences Requirements (BA only)
 - → Foreign Language through Intermediate II (2050) level
 - → Distribution Requirement (6 hours)
- Minimum of 42 advanced hours (3000 or 4000 level courses) ★
- Minimum of 120 overall hours (any level)

Major Requirements for both BA & BS

- 36 hours in 3 fields of study; 12 hours in each field
- One field must come from the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences (CLASS).
- Students cannot complete 2 fields from the same College or School with the exception of CLASS.
- Students are responsible for course pre-requisites, but not pre-major courses.
- Courses cannot apply toward both an Integrative Studies field and a minor or a double major/degree.
- Grade of "C" or better required in all courses used in the 3 fields.

Bachelor of Arts

- 12 hours in each field
- At least 6 HOURS in each field must be advanced
- Foreign Language through Intermediate II
 - → May apply to major below
- CLASS Distribution Requirement (6 hours)
 (2019+ Catalog only)
 - → May apply to major below

Bachelor of Science

- 12 hours in each field
- At least **9 HOURS** in each field must be advanced
- Other Course Requirements (OCR):
 6 advanced hours selected from approved list
 - → Cannot apply to major below

Canvas (unt.instructure.com) – You must complete the "Getting Started in Integrative Studies" informational course before you can officially declare your Integrative Studies major. Once you are declared, you will be added to the noncredit "Marketability, Internships and Careers" course.
