REMINDER ABOUT ADVANCED ELECTIVES

Next time you meet with an advisor, ask about electives needed for your degree. Our Bachelor of Arts Degrees in MRTS, CBCM, COMM, TECM, DANC and THEA require 120 total hours, and at least 42 of those hours must be at the advanced level. Most students in those degree plans need some advanced electives to complete their degree. Advanced electives are any courses at the 3***/4*** level. As long as you meet the pre-reqs, you can take any course, and there are many departments that offer advanced level courses with no pre-reqs! Ask an advisor how many advanced electives you need to complete your degree!
